****examples of chores/responsibilities include:** Load Dishwasher, Set Table, Make Bed, Take Out Trash, Help with Indoor Chores, Clean Up Room, Do Homework, Get Ready for Bed, Show Respect, No Teasing, Empty Dishwasher, Put Toys Away, Stop Whining, Brush Teeth, Don't Use Bad Language, Take Care of Pet, Put Clothes in Wash, Keep Hands to Yourself, Clean Table, Share, Apologize to Someone, Say Please and Thank You, Take a Bath, Get Dressed, and Help with Outdoor Chores

Many parents like to use the pay system (\$0.10 per chore and \$1 per large chore (clean room or bathroom weekly) You can teach your child to tithe, save, budget their wants and needs. Whether it is a trip to MacDonalds, buying a toy, ice cream, etc... they can learn to use their own money.
